Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a voluntary, strengths- and evidence-based, early childhood home visiting program, provided by certified educators dedicated to supporting families through increasing parent-child interaction, understanding of child development, and connecting to community resources.

Monthly or biweekly visits provide:

- Child development information
- Age-appropriate child development activities
- Regular screenings to identify potential development delays, health issues, and home safety concerns
- Postpartum depression screenings
- Parenting skills support
- Information and support to prevent child abuse and neglect
- Information about food and nutrition
- Community resource information

Other PAT offerings:

- Monthly Group Connections
- Love and Logic[™] parenting classes
- Child developmental screening events

Adaptations and Additions:

- All visits are virtual or by phone, with an over 90% retention rate of families
- Monthly Group Connections, Love and Logic[™] parenting classes, and child screening events have all been adapted to virtual offerings
- Additional videos created and shared on Facebook and YouTube to highlight popular parenting topics
- Delivered masks, hand sanitizer, and child developmental activities to enrolled families
- PAT earned the Blue Ribbon Status, making it one of the top-performing home visiting affiliates

Literacy Council strengthens our community by providing English language tutoring to Sheboygan County adults, ultimately breaking cycles of illiteracy. Staff train caring, community volunteers to provide tutoring using student-centered methods that earn results.

Other Literacy Council offerings:

- U.S Citizenship classes at LTC
- Tutor support at LTC through open labs
- Workplace Literacy Program

Student goal examples:

- learn English (verbal, reading, and writing)
- create a résumé and apply for jobs
- pass the written driver's license test
- study and earn GED
- study for U.S. Citizenship test and interview
- learn how to read prescription labels

Adaptations and Additions:

- Offered NEW Virtual Tutor training with 11 new tutors trained
- Created a new Virtual Learning Basics class to support tutors and students
- Provided tutors and students with face masks, plexiglass shields, sanitizing wipes, and hand sanitizer
- Staff developing new virtual office hours to support tutors beginning January 2021
- Continue to offer more online resources and virtual interactions to encourage tutors and students to continue meeting goals







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
